DISTRICT SUPPORT PARTNER AGREEMENT NUMBER: PJN/RAPID/SWF-01-23

IN SUPPORT OF,Program Title: Bridging the Barriers - Inclusion of Transgender Community in Flood Relief and Response that PJN is implementing in 33 floods affected districts in collaboration with National Commission for Human Rights (NCHR) support by the Concern Worldwide and USAID Bureau of Humanitarian Response (BHA).

To protect and ensure access to the transgender community in flood response, the PJN is engaging District Support Partner (DSP) for the establishment of "National Transgender Safety Net for Inclusive Flood Relief and Humanitarian Response".

Key Results:

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- Transgender community is facilitated under humanitarian response by organizations and government programs working in the district on floods response
- Transgender fellow included in district disaster response committee
- Capacity building of 20-25 government and civil society organizations involved in humanitarian response on transgender-inclusive humanitarian response and safeguarding
- Awareness raising of transgender community persons through awareness clinics, events, and dissemination of awareness material

Key Outcomes:

- Outcome 2: Improved access of Transgender Community to flood Relief and rehabilitation Services
- Outcome 3: Increased Awareness and Empowering Transgender Community to better protect and engage in flood relief and rehabilitation efforts

This Partnership Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement') is made between the Peace & Justice Network (hereinafter referred to as "PJN") and Sahara Welfare Foundation (hereinafter referred to as "DSP")

WHEREASPJN is engaging DSP for program activities ensuring transgender community inclusion in flood response mentioned in Annex A and Annex B on the terms and conditions as herein set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, the PJN and DSP agree as follows:



1. Agreement Documents

1.1 The following documents attached hereto shall be deemed to form an integral part of this Agreement in the following order of precedence:

i. This agreement

- ii. Annex A: Program Document
- iii. Annex B: Financials (Milestone-wise Payments)
- iv. Vendor General Terms and Conditions
- 1.2 This Agreement and the Annexes attached hereto shall form the entire Agreement between the PJN and DSP, superseding the contents of any other negotiations and/or agreements, whether oral or in writing, pertaining to the subject of this Agreement.

2. Purpose of the Agreement

- 2.1 The purpose of this Agreement is expressly set forth in Annex A.
- 2.2 DSP is responsible for the submission of means of verification as given in Annex B.

3. Duration of this Agreement

- 3.1 This Agreement is effective as of February 01st, 2023 or the date of the last signature below, whichever is the later.
- 3.2 The agreement will be for the period of 3 months ending April 30th, 2023.

4. Role of the DSP

- 4.1 The DSP shall:
 - a. Have full responsibility for ensuring that the Activity is implemented in accordance with the Agreement
 - b. Be responsible, in the event of financial review, audit or evaluation for providing the necessary accounting documents
 - c. Be responsible for providing all documents and information to PJN which may be required under the relevant payment requests

5. Agreement Amount and Payments

- 5.1 The Total Agreement amount per district is **Rs.354,500** (Three Hundred Fifty-Four Thousand and Five Hundred only) as detail given in Annex B.Total agreement amount **354,500**
- 5.2 Payments to the DSP shall be made after the approval of MoVs submitted against the milestones on 5th of each month.

6. Reporting and Evaluation

- 6.1 The DSP shall submit to the following milestone reports during the life of this Agreement in the formats provided in Annex D, and in line with above Payment Schedule, (as per clause 5.2):
 - (a) ToPJN, monthly milestone report along with MoVsand Invoice with financial report; and
- 6.2 Within 10 (ten) calendar days of the end date specified in clause 3.2 above, the DSP shall submit the following reports in the formats provided in Annex D:
 - (a) To PJN, the DSP will submit Project Completion Report.



6.3 Failure to submit the reports specified in clause 5.2 without due cause shall constitute a failure to fulfil a substantial obligation of this Agreement. The DSP shall be deemed discharged from its obligation under this Agreement only upon

the receipt and acceptance of the reports referred to in clause 5.2.

7. Special Conditions

DSP shall Undertakes certification of the information / data submitted to PJN. The DSP is responsible to generate, slot and produce the means of verification to authenticate the information / data submitted to PJN on agreed intervals.

Project Title: Bridging the Barriers - Inclusion of Transgender Community in Flood Relief and Rehabilitation Response

The Transgender community in Pakistan is an already marginalized group and has been further marginalized by the devastating 2022 flooding that has affected over 33 million people and left millions deprived of basic needs. The field rapid assessment's preliminary analysis and the information presented by the community all point to the fact that transgender community has been missing from all levels the discourse around the flood relief efforts.

To address, Peace & Justice Network Pakistan (PJN) has started a national flood emergency advocacy, capacity development and awareness program for transgender inclusion aims to build a robust coordination and protection mechanism in order to make the flood relief and response efforts more responsive to the needs of Transgender community at national, provincial and in 33 targeted districts that PJN in doing in collaboration with National Commission for Human Rights (NCHR) supported by Concern Worldwide/USAID-Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (BHA).

The project aims to contribute towards the inclusion of Transgender community in flood relief and response, with greater recognition and protection of the rights of Transgender community.

The program have following three key objectives:

- Outcome 1: National Integrated Response and Coordination Mechanism establish to ensure inclusion of Transgender in Flood Relief and rehabilitation activities
- Outcome 2: Improved access of Transgender Community to flood Relief and rehabilitation Services
- Outcome 3: Increased Awareness and Empowering Transgender Community to better protect and engage in flood relief and rehabilitation efforts

Roles & Responsibilities District Support Partner:

For the establishment of "National Transgender Safety Net for Inclusive Flood Relief and Humanitarian Response", the key responsibility of the District Support Partner will be to play an effective role in the establishment of Transgender Safety Net for Inclusive Flood Relief and Humanitarian Response in their respective districts. Specific responsibilities include:

- Build coordination with the district government departments and humanitarian organizations working in flood relief and rehabilitation response and ensure that they have included the transgender community.
- Host Transgender Fellow for 3 months in their respective offices as District Coordinator that PJN will train and develop.
- Facilitate PJN is executing the following District level activities:
 - Conducting Coordination Meetings with District Disaster Management Committee, District Administration, and Humanitarian Organizations
 - Facilitating Training for the Capacity building of local relief organizations (including Trans
 focused organizations) and relevant government departments in the District on
 including Flood Disaster Relief and Response and Transgender Safeguarding during flood
 relief and response work
 - Organizing Transgender community leaders and state district dialogues to ensure inclusion
 - 4. Development of Awareness Material for the Transgender Community on Protection and Relief Services for both in-person and social media campaigns
 - 5. Organize community awareness clinics in targeted district

KEY DISTRICT RESULTS:

- Transgender community is facilitated under humanitarian response by organizations and government programs working in the district on floods response (Share list) (events and one to one meetings)
- Transgender fellow included in district disaster response committee (Share notification)
- Capacity building of 20-25 government and civil society organizations involved in humanitarian response on transgender-inclusive humanitarian response and safeguarding (organize in collaboration with DC office and involve members of the District Disaster Management Committee)
- Awareness raising of transgender community persons through awareness clinics, events, and dissemination of awareness material
